Master Class in Film Directing by the Prize-Winning Japanese Film Director

The University of Zurich together with the Ginmaku Japanese Film Festival and the Swiss-Japanese Society announces the second master class in film directing, held this time on May 22, 2018 by the young Japanese director and poet Nakagawa Ryutaro 中川龍太郎.

Director Nakagawa will appear at the University of Zurich for an evening of discussions of moviemaking, on his own works, and on the state of Japanese film tradition.

Born in 1990, he is a young and upcoming Japanese

film director. He has already written and directed six acclaimed films, although he is still in his twenties. In response to this sizable body of work and for the appearance of his prize-winning films at film festivals across the globe, he has been called the great young prodigy of Japanese film making: a talented young director with great promise for the future. Lately he has also founded a new film production company called Tokyo New Cinema that produces, distributes, and promotes his films and those of other directors.



He is also a talented poet and has recently published a collected volume, entitled *Falling Snow in the Capital*, 雪に至る都: 詩集. He is an important voice arguing for the new generation of Japanese directors who follow in the footsteps of Kurosawa, Ozu, and others in the great Japanese tradition of film directors. One of his often-repeated claims is that "the new generation of Japanese films will brighten society." With his prodigious output, technical skills, and outstanding films, it is highly likely that he will be a significant force during the next decades of Japanese film making.

The first master class was held by the Japanese master director of documentaries, Kazuhiro Soda, in April, 2016. Like the session held by Director Soda, we are planning for this to be an informal, interactive evening with discussions on the arts of the cinema.





The audience will be encouraged to ask questions and the evening will include short sections from his films, with commentary from the director. It should be a fun and informative evening for anyone interested in Japan and its cinematic tradition.
