The Power of Agency

Synopsis

The course examines the capacity for human agency. We shall examine a series of questions intended to elucidate the nature of this capacity, including: What is an agential ability? How are agential abilities related to agential control? What is the connection between the capacity for agency and the capacity to move one's body? Can agency be understood as the capacity to cause change? If so, what sort of change? What kind of thing is an action: is an action an event? A process? Something else? What about activity? And what is the connection between action and activity?
